

If you do not understand foundational concepts such as statistical validation the value of many of the chapters in this book will be limited. Overall, this is an academic read, not something for those with only a passing interest in the subject of intelligence.

The only negative aspect of the book comes from the authors of the different chapters having little or no familiarity with the subjects in the other chapters. However, this is a minor criticism and the reader should be able to identify the issues during a critical review, minimizing any confusion.
